Dear brothers and sisters in Christ.

As we come near the end of the turbulent year, the following words of Scripture may give us some consolation: "The Lord our God be with us, as he was with our ancestors; may he not leave us or abandon us" (1 Kgs 8:57). The Lord surely has continued to bless the work of vocations in our Archdiocese. I am glad to share with you the following updates in this newsletter:

- Archbishop Michael Miller will ordain Deacon Richard Conlin a priest.
- Archbishop Michael ordained Raffaele Salvino a deacon.
- Four senior seminarians took the next step in their formation. Archbishop Michael instituted Patrick Le and William Mancao as Lectors and admitted Medard Kamanzi and Solomon Nguyen as Candidates for Holy Orders.
- All seven senior seminarians were able to have pastoral internship in the summer despite the challenges of the pandemic. Some of them have shown a great deal of creativity and innovation in their approach to pastoral ministry.
- They also participated in weekly formation meetings in the summer with sessions given by various leaders in the Archdiocese.
- Four young men have decided to discern the diocesan priesthood further by entering the Spirituality Year,

- bringing the total number of seminarians this year to 21. Three men from Redemptoris Mater Seminary finished their English studies and began their intellectual formation at Seminary of Christ the King. There were six other young men and women in Vancouver who have joined various religious orders.
- The monthly Discerners' gatherings continued online.
 The camaraderie was not lacking, as some seminarians as well as Fr. Hien Nguyen, Director of the Spirituality Year, could join the meeting easily with a click of a button.
- The first iteration of 'Come Follow Me', the pilot formation/discernment program for young Filipino men, completed successfully under the direction of Deacon Greg Barcelon and Tito Goco.

I hope you find this email informative and encouraging. Thank you for your generous support of Vocations in Vancouver. Please continue to pray for our seminarians and for more vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. We are a vocation-producing diocese!

PRIESTLY ORDINATION OF DEACON RICHARD CONLIN



Archbishop Michael has called Deacon Richard to the Holy Order of the Priesthood. The Ordination will be held at 7 p.m. PST on Friday, December 11, 2020 at Holy Rosary Cathedral. Due to the COVID-19 restrictions, the

Ordination will be accessible to the general public via livestream only.

Since his Diaconal Ordination last December, Deacon Richard has been assisting Fr. Bruce-John Hamilton at Corpus Christi Parish. He has successfully completed the Diaconal Formation Program facilitated by Fr. Paul Goo, preparing for the priesthood in the following areas: Evangelization, Sacraments and Sacramentals, Homiletics, Rule of Life, Parish Administration, Spiritual Life, Relational Ministry, and Interpersonal Well-Being.

Deacon Richard has demonstrated exemplary zeal for souls. Running the Virtual Summer Camp for altar servers, conducting interviews with priests, and playing video games with the youth, are some of the new forms of ministry that he has pioneered in collaboration with Seminarians Alexis Boquiren and Kuan Tsai.

There will be a 9-day novena to Our Lady of Guadalupe leading up to the Ordination. We invite you to participate in the novena to pray that Deacon Richard may imitate Christ the Good Shepherd who laid down His life for the sheep and that the Archdiocese of Vancouver may be united by this moment of hope during these challenging times.

DIACONAL ORDINATION OF RAFFAELE SALVINO



From *The B.C. Catholic*, October 29, 2020: Archbishop J. Michael Miller, CSB celebrated the first ordination in the Lower Mainland since the COVID-19 pandemic began

in March, calling the occasion a "ray of light amidst the pandemic."

Raffaele Salvino was ordained a deacon at Holy Rosary Cathedral in Vancouver Oct. 23, taking him one step closer to the priesthood. The small congregation celebrating with him included his parents, three brothers, grandmother, a few friends, and priests who have accompanied him on his spiritual journey.

"We feel blessed. We are so happy and joyful and filled with hope," said mother Louise Salvino. Salvino's father, Luigi, said despite trying times during the pandemic, "I see many lights, and I see this as one of them."

Deacon Salvino, who grew up in Our Lady of Sorrows Parish, said he was invited to participate actively in the church community from a young age, but didn't consider the priesthood until his university years. He described his change of heart in a testimony printed in the booklet at his ordination. (Read the full article on bccatholic.ca.)

ACCOMPANYING DISCERNERS


